Heard the learned counsel for the respective sides.

The petitioner apprehends his arrest in connection with Complaint Case registered as Economic Offences No. 20 of 2017.

It has been alleged that the petitioner had deducted T.D.S. to the tune of Rs. 7,71,146/- for the financial year 2014-15, but failed to deposit the same in the account of the Central Government.

It has been stated at the outset by learned counsel for the petitioner that the entire T.D.S. amount for the period 2014-15 has already been deposited.

Mr. Rahul Lamba, learned counsel appearing for the opposite party no. 2 has accepted the said fact.

In view of the fact that the petitioner has discharged his liability by depositing the T.D.S. for the financial year 2014-15, I am inclined to extend the privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. The petitioner, named above, is therefore directed to surrender in the court below within four weeks from today and on such surrender, he shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Special Judge, Economic Offences, Dhanbad in connection with Complaint Case Registered as Economic Offences No. 20 of 2017, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.

This application stands allowed. Pending I.A., if any, stands disposed of.
